


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

Moving in, Moving Out The Interstate Compact

The Interstate Compact on Educational Opportunity for Military Children surrounds four issues:

Enrollment Placement Eligibility Graduation

Enrollment

Unofficial records must be accepted upon initial enrollment.

Students are given 30 days to get shots (not TB tests).

Sending school must send official transcripts within 10 days of receiving the request.

Placement

Placement in advanced classes will be granted based on the sending state's schedule of classes.

A student may go to the next grade if pre-K or kindergarten has been completed in the sending state.

Moving in, Moving Out The Interstate Compact (Continued)

Eligibility

If a parent is deployed, the school district cannot charge tuition for out of zone attendance if the child is placed in temporary custody with an adult at a different address, but wants to attend the current school.

If a parent is deployed. The Power of Attorney for Guardianship is sufficient for enrollment and all other parental permissions needed by the school.

Schools must provide opportunities for participation in extracurricular activities regardless of deadline if the student is qualified.

Graduation

Courses required for graduation can be waived if similar work has been completed in another school.

Flexibility in accepting the sending state's exit or end of course exams, achievement tests or alternate tests in lieu of current state testing requirements.

Allowing a student to receive a diploma from the sending school if graduation requirements have been met.
