Navy celebrates women's history

Each year the United States designates March as National Women's History Month to ensure that the history of American women is recognized and celebrated in schools, workplaces, and communities throughout the country.

Recognizing the achievements of women in all facets of life - science, community, government, literature, art, sports, medicine - inspires women to pursue new opportunities and traditionally male occupations, such as military service.

The Navy recognizes the contribution, commitment and continued achievements of women who have served in the sea service for more than 100 years.

Currently more than 59,000 active duty women and more than 9,000 Reserve women serve in the Navy. Making up 18 percent of the total force, women make numerous contributions to our Navy's mission and readiness.

Additionally, more than 54,000 women

serve in a wide range of specialties as Navy civilians. Women who lead in the Navy's total force include 32 active and Reserve flag officers, 69 senior executive service members, 48 command master chiefs and three command senior chiefs. Among those 48 is Naval Air Station Key West CMC Lisa Terrell.

The history of women serving in the Navy dates back to 1908, when Congress established the U.S. Navy Nurse Corps.

The first 20 Navy nurses were women, who became known as the "Sacred Twenty." As one of the "Sacred Twenty," Lenah S. Higbee was one of the first women to serve formally as a member of the Navy.

In 1909, Higbee was promoted to Chief Nurse at Norfolk Naval Hospital, and in 1911 she became the Superintendent of the Navy Nurse Corps, serving throughout the duration of World War I. The Navy recognized Higbee's distinguished service as Superintendent of the Navy Nurse Corps, awarding her the Navy Cross.

A day in the life: Guardians of the sky

"You need to have quick reaction, think 3D, be morally sound and have good time management," said Radar Room Facility Watch Supervisor AC2 Matthew Chappell, as he described what it takes to be a Navy air traffic controller.

Naval Air Station Key West's air traffic controllers oversee three branches in support of air combat training for squadron detachments: Flight planning, radar room and tower control.

With more than 60 ACs currently assigned to NAS Key West's Operations Department, personnel are divided into several teams to work seven days a week.

The controllers work within the different branches throughout the week, said AC2 Meghan Ray. They are at their posts until air field operations are concluded for the day.

According to Chappell, the AC community is very competitive with Sailors working toward job qualifications through constant training.

Mar. 15

1947 - Ensign John W. Lee, Jr., becomes the first African-American with a commission in the regular Navy and serves aboard USS Kearsarge (CV 33).

Mar. 16

1966 - Gemini 8 is launched. Former naval aviator Neil Armstrong and Air Force Maj. David R. Scott, are on this mission.

Mar. 17

1959 - USS Skate (SSN-578) becomes the first submarine to surface at the North Pole.

Mar. 18

2006 - While conducting maritime security operations in the Indian Ocean, USS Cape St. George (CG 71) and USS Gonzalez (DDG 66) return fire on a group of pirates, killing one and wounding five.

Mar. 19

1918 - Ensign Stephen Potter is the first American to shoot down an enemy seaplane off the German coast.

Mar. 20

1922 - USS Jupiter (Fuel Ship 3) is recommissioned as USS Langley (CV 1), the Navy's first aircraft carrier.

Mar. 21

1917 - Loretta Walsh becomes the first woman Navy petty officer when sworn in as chief yeoman.

FFSC opportunity preps new babysitters

Potential babysitters now have an opportunity to meet with a life skills educator as they begin preparing for what will likely be their first and one of the most important jobs.

Ginny Prior, life skills educator at the Fleet and Family Support Center on Sigsbee Park, will schedule an informational session for youth ages 12 and older who are interested in becoming baby sitters. Twelve is the minimum babysitting age for those living on NAS Key West.

Another way to prepare for babysitting is to

take the American Red Cross Babysitter Basics course, which is a four-hour online course designed for youth ages 11 and older.

Topics include: how to provide care for infants and children, how to stay safe, what to do in an emergency, how to choose age-appropriate activities and how to recognize and handle a variety of behaviors. Students also learn the basics of starting a babysitting business.

The course consists of six interactive modules featuring video, activities, games and tools that babysitters can use to build their knowledge and skills and manage their babysitting business.

better themselves professionally by passing down his knowledge and maintenance skills acquired as a flight deck troubleshooter, mobile electronics technician and as a supervisor.

As a participant in USMAP, Crisostomo encourages others to enroll in the program and informs them about its benefits. He also promotes the development of junior Sailors by assisting them with Naval programs and opportunities including creating study sessions for advancement.

Crisostomo is assigned to FRCSE Det. Key West as Work Center 930's leading petty officer. He is responsible for the maintenance of aeronautical and ground equipment support for Naval Air Station

Key West and transient commands, including the repair of 15 mobile electric power plants, seven mobile air conditioning units, five static frequency converters and seven lighting carts.

Crisostomo provides the transient commands with fully operational gear, allowing squadrons to test aircraft systems. He is also the division's calibration petty officer and has been instrumental in the turn-around of the command's hydraulic contamination program.

"I am honored to be selected as the Level II Mentor of the Year," said Crisostomo after receiving the award. "I want to make a difference with the junior Sailors, and I do that by leading from example."





Peers support the efforts with positive feedback to aid Sailors in their professional development.

ACs conduct daily training on the 13 qualification positions needed to safely and effectively direct aircraft operating from airfields; not just at Boca Chica Field, but also for Key West International Airport.

"You need to have team dependence and professionalism," Chappell added.

Air Traffic Control Facility Officer Lt. Cmdr. Michael Therrien describes a typical day for the ACs as going from an easy monitoring five aircraft to a high-speed environment of directing 40 aircraft.

ACs also provide the latest schedules and local maps for training missions with visits to the flight planning room.

Other ACs are assigned to tower control and

direct aircraft and vehicle traffic on the airfield runways during air operations.

Authorization to enter NAS Key West air space comes from the approach controller. Then it is the sector controller who clears aircraft entering or leaving warning areas - air space where training is being conducted.

Once aircraft are airborne for a mission, they stay in constant communication with the ACs in the radar room facility and tower control for up-to-date flight instructions and emergency procedures.

In the event of any emergency, all branches and several key personnel are informed using the crash phone, an emergency auto dial red phone set for personnel requiring the need-to-know.

"We go above and beyond so they [pilots] get what they need," said Therrien.



CNO directs establishment of new type command

for Information Dominance Public Affairs

Chief of Naval Operations Admiral Jonathan Greenert has directed Commander, U.S. Fleet Forces Command to establish an Information Dominance Type Command.

In his March 4 memorandum to CUSFFC, Greenert wrote, "I approve the establishment of Navy Information Dominance Forces as an echelon III command under your administrative control. As the immediate superior in command, oversee the command's implementation ... with an initial operating capability of 1 October 2014."

The TYCOM will report directly to CUSFFC and have supporting relationships with the rest of the Navy, focusing primarily on the Navy's information environment.

Commander, Navy Cyber Forces, Rear Adm. Diane Webber will have her command re-designated as Commander, Navy Information Dominance Forces and will provide the initial infrastructure,

resources and assets for the able, sustainable, combat-TYCOM. ready information dominance forces."

Webber noted that the new TYCOM's mission will be to "support combatant commanders and Navy commanders ashore and afloat by providing forward deployment Full operational capability for NAVIDFOR is expected by the end of the calendar year.

Supplements prove to be bitter pills rather than magic bullets

FROM CHIEF OF NAVAL PERSONNEL PUBLIC AFFAIRS

March is Navy Nutrition Month and the Navy's Nutrition Office, part of the 21st Century Sailor Office, is committed to spreading the word on healthy eating.

A recent article in "Nutrition Journal" suggests that people looking to take a dietary supplement already have somewhat of a healthy eating pattern with regular exercise in their routine.

Supplements may be necessary if adequate nutrition

is not available through food due to reasons such as medical conditions that effect the digestive system, food allergies, intolerances or being on a medically-supervised special diet with food restrictions. Otherwise, having a well-balanced dietary pattern with a variety of foods is adequate and more effective than taking supplements.

Dietary supplement marketing claims to solve numerous health problems, from relieving symptoms of simple medical concerns like the common cold to stopping a heart attack dead in its tracts. If dietary

supplements really worked and produced a true quick and lasting solution to any health concern, then we would all be in optimal health without the need to visit the doctor.

"The Los Angeles Times" reported in 2013 that Americans spend just under \$30 billion each year in dietary supplements including vitamins, herbs, and other such products that promise more energy, weight loss, or more muscle mass.

It's foolish to believe the marketing and hype surrounding a product without doing the proper research.

Some news articles claim supplements to be safe, where science and research may say otherwise. Supplement labeling and ingredients are not always accurate and sometimes misleading.

Last year the DOD removed Jack3d and Oxyelite Pro, along with 17 other supplement brands, from the retail stores on military bases. This was because the labels claimed one of the ingredients, geranium, as a natural plant derivative, when in actuality, the real ingredient in these supplements was 1,3-dimethylamylamine, a synthetic drug

used in the 1940s as a nasal decongestant. DMAA has been linked to severe side effects like heat injuries, seizures, brain hemorrhages and heart problems.

There may be numerous other supplements currently on the market that have unknown and potentially harmful ingredients in them. Visit Operation Supplement Safety at <http://hprc-online.org/dietary-supplements/opss> to get the latest tools and resources to help you make a wise and informed decision when purchasing supplements.

A Navy TYCOM, coordinates the man, train and equip functions for specific communities within the Navy. For example, Commander, Naval Air Forces exercises administrative control over aviation forces and Commander, Navy Surface Forces does the same for the surface warfare community.

NAVIDFOR will serve in that capacity for the Information Dominance Corps.

The IDC was formed in 2009 and built on the deep expertise and strengths of the officers/enlisted, active/reserve, and civilian workforce from the oceanography/meteorology, information professional, information warfare, naval intelligence and space cadre. The IDC is an inter-disciplinary corps that possesses a deep understanding of potential adversaries and the battle space, is able to accurately identify targets and brings an array of non-kinetic, offensive and defensive

capabilities to the fight in the "Information Age."

According to Vice Adm. Ted N. Branch, deputy chief of Naval Operations for Information Dominance and the lead for the Navy's IDC, "The continuing evolution of information dominance as a Navy warfighting discipline demands a single, integrated TYCOM to provide relevant and effective capabilities, including a highly trained and motivated workforce. I'm confident the new NAVIDFOR will provide the fleet and the entire Navy the ID capabilities needed to deter, fight and win within this information domain."

Previously, those MT and E functions for the various communities within the IDC were executed by OPNAV N2/N6, Fleet Cyber Command/Commander 10th Fleet, Navy Cyber Forces, the Office of Naval Intelligence, and the Navy Meteorology and Oceanography Command.

In 1944, the Navy commemorated Higbee's naval service, naming a ship in her honor. USS Higbee (DD 806) was the first combatant ship to be named after a woman.

The Navy's first enlisted women, more commonly known as yeomen (F), or yeomanettes, provided clerical support during World War I.

Capt. Joy Bright Hancock initially enlisted as a yeoman (F), serving until the end of World War I, by which time she had risen to the rank of chief petty officer. In 1942, during World War II, she was commissioned as a lieutenant in the Women Accepted for Volunteer Emergency Service program. Hancock rose to the rank of captain

and led the WAVES through the 1940s and 1950s, facilitating the addition of women as a permanent part of the Navy.

Master Chief Yeoman Anna Der-Vartanian entered the Navy through the WAVES. She was not only the first woman to hold the rank of master chief in the Navy, but also across all armed services.

Darlene Iskra was one of the first female line officers to graduate from the Naval School of Diving and Salvage in Washington, D.C.

As a lieutenant commander, Darlene Iskra became the first Navy woman to command a ship when she assumed command of USS Opportune (ARS 41) in 1990. Iskra took her ship, a Bolster-class rescue and salvage ship, to patrol the Suez Canal during Operation Desert Storm,

ensuring the canal remained clear for commerce.

Most recently, Vice Adm. Michelle Howard was nominated for appointment to the rank of admiral and assignment as vice chief of naval operations. Upon confirmation, she will make history as the Navy's first female four-star admiral, and first African-American and first woman to serve as the vice chief.

Today, women in the Navy, both officer and enlisted, hold leadership positions aboard warships, of carrier air wings and squadrons, recruiting districts, training stations, and shipyards. As the Navy continues to progress forward, previously closed billets will open to women and the Navy will continue to witness women making history and new "firsts."
