Armed Forces Day recognizes unified military

This year marks the 64th anniversary of Armed Forces Day, established to recognize and honor all members of the armed forces.

The day is celebrated annu-

ally on the third Saturday of May. At Naval Air Station Key West, active duty military representing all branches of service will compete Friday in the Armed Forces Command Challenge at Sigsbee Field. The event runs from 6:30 a.m. - 1 p.m. Dependents are invited to

watch. On Aug. 31, 1949, Secretary of Defense Louis Johnson announced the creation of an Armed Forces Day to replace separate Army, Navy, Marine Corps and Air Force Days. The single day celebration stemmed from the unification

of the Armed Forces under the Department of Defense.

At the first observation of Armed Forces Day, President Harry S. Truman praised the work of the military services at home and across the seas.

Safe Boating Week promotes life jackets

Of all the precautions boaters can take to keep themselves safe on the water, the most effective safety device is a life jacket, according to the National Safe Boating Council.

The NSBC, organized in 1958, promotes safe recreational boating through education, outreach and training. It also promotes National Safe Boating Week, which begins Saturday and runs through May 23.

The U.S. Coast Guard Auxiliary, Big Pine Key, is participating in the campaign by distributing safe boating information at meet-and-greets planned at various Lower Keys locations.

OMD Sailors earn award for excellence

The South Florida Executive Board recognized Naval Air Station Key West's Operations Maintenance Division May 9 during the 49th Annual Federal Employee of the Year Awards Program.

The OMD crew received the Team Trade and Crafts

Award, which was one of only 19 awards presented to federal employees representing Broward, Miami-Dade, Monroe and Palm Beach counties.

"The South Florida FEB sponsors this interagency awards program each year to recognize the exceptional service and accomplishment of civilian and military service members who have dedicated their careers to public service,"

said FEB Chairwoman Dania Perdomo-Borras in the event program.

President John F. Kennedy introduced the first 10 Federal Executive Boards in 1961 for the principle purpose of strengthening and coordinating the activities of government operations outside the Washington, D.C. area. Today's

This Week in Naval History

May 16

1965 - The first U.S. naval gunfire support in Vietnam is performed by USS Henry W. Tucker (DD 875).

May 17

1987 - USS Stark (FFG 31) is struck by two Iraqi Exocet missiles in the Persian Gulf, killing 37 Sailors and wounding 21.

May 18

1775 - Col. Benedict Arnold captures a British sloop at St. Johns in Quebec, Canada.

May 19

1882 - Commodore Robert Shufeldt arrives in Korea to negotiate the first commerce treaty with Korea.

May 20

1943 - The Tenth Fleet is established in Washington D.C., to coordinate U.S. anti-submarine operations in the Atlantic.

May 21

1960 - USS Kitty Hawk (CVA 63) is launched. She serves during Vietnam and on the Pacific Coast until home ported in Yokosuka, Japan. Kitty Hawk decommissions in May 2009.

May 22

1967 - New York City reaches an agreement to purchase the New York Naval Shipyard after it was closed in 1966.

They kept me on the straight and narrow. If it was not for them I would still be lost in the woods looking for my ball.



Boatswain's mate retires after 20 years

BM1 Richard Grier has traveled the world, and in those travels met his wife, trained foreign forces and learned about the ageless duties of a boatswain's mate.

On May 23, Grier will close his military career with 20 years of service in an afternoon ceremony at the Sunset Lounge at Sigsbee Park.

A native of the Philippines, Grier moved to upstate New York when he was 3 and spent his youth there. On May 17, 1994, Grier visited a Navy recruiter and signed up for the delayed entry program and just over two months later, he reported to Recruit Training Command, Great Lakes, Illinois.

After graduating boot camp and seaman apprenticeship training, Seaman Recruit Grier reported to his first command, USS Merrill (DD 976), in San Diego, California. While on board Merrill, Grier completed two western Pacific cruises, earned the Shellback and Golden Shellback certificates, and became schooled in the

timeless role of a boatswain's mate.

Merrill decommissioned in March 1998 and BM3 Grier reported to Panama City, Florida, where he was a small-boat coxswain at the Naval Diving and Salvage Training Center. While in Panama City he worked with Air Force parachute jumpers, Army underwater combat engineers, Marine reconnaissance and Navy divers. He also worked with a sea lion detachment and participated in a five-day experimental saturation dive.



Grier

In the spring of 2001, Grier reported to Norfolk, Virginia, where he met USS Nimitz (CVN 68) in the shipyards. In the fall of 2001, Nimitz changed its homeport to San Diego. While stationed on the Nimitz, Grier completed another Western Pacific cruise.

In December 2004 reported to Sigonella, Sicily, where he was the leading petty officer for Morale, Welfare and

Recreation and assistant director of community activities. He later transitioned to the position of LPO for Port Liaison, coordinating the arrival of incoming Navy ships. He also met the woman who would become his wife in October of 2008.

In January 2008, Grier transferred to Guam as part of a forward-deployed Mobile Security Squadron. As the LPO of the boat detachment, he participated in land and waterborne operations worldwide. He also participated in Thailand Cobra Gold and Cooperation Afloat Readiness and Training, in which he trained other countries in military tactics.

Grier transferred to Naval Air Station Key West in February 2010. Although starting at MWR, he was selected to fill the vacant Command Career Counselor chief petty officer billet. Although he had no formal training when he assumed the position, his efforts resulted in NAS Key West receiving the retention excellence award two of the three years in which he served in the position.

and claims and more via the websites and phone.

NBHC Key West's on-site HBAs remain available to discuss options for complex issues; however, they are unable to make changes on a patient's behalf. The reason is that HBAs work for the branch health clinic, while website and phone staff work for Tricare's regional contractor, Humana Military.

The technology is improving rapidly and many companies are offering products, but some are better than others. Where many LED lamps are in the same fixture, a good design is required to dissipate heat so that the LEDs can operate efficiently and not degrade quickly. There is a wide range of fixture quality on the market, so be cautious about major investments and do some research before buying.

LED products are generally

more efficient than incandescent, so applications that have traditionally used incandescent lights, such as flashlights and Christmas lights, benefit from LED technology. In the case of flashlights, batteries last longer and light can be directed more precisely.

Some LED down light products are as efficient as the best compact fluorescent products, and some LED general area lighting systems are almost as efficient as the best linear fluorescent systems, but the cost of LED is still high compared to fluorescent. Since general lighting requires that many LED lamps be installed close together, do your research to make sure the fixture will last, and check on the warranty.

LED lighting is becoming more common for outdoor

night lighting. Because LEDs are so directional, fixtures can be designed to use considerably less energy than traditional high-intensity discharge fixtures, and the long lamp life can save a lot of money on lamp replacements for hard-to-reach locations.

LEDs have many other useful attributes, including excellent dimming capability, compact size, no ultraviolet radiation emissions or warm-up time required, and good color rendition for most models.

LED technology is transforming the lighting industry. The Department of Energy has followed the evolution of the technology and produced volumes of useful information. A simple internet search on the internet can provide information.



Spill response team trains steady, keeps ready

Naval Air Station Key West Sailors and first responders joined forces with Key West Pipeline and federal agencies in responding to a pipeline rupture scenario for a spill response drill May 13.


The scenario, part of hurricane exercise Citadel Gale, was that a Category 4 storm had passed by Key West, leaving debris obstructing roads. As an employee cleared debris at Boca Chica Field, the front loader simulated striking a segment of the Key

West Pipeline, creating a jet fuel spill.

Naval Air Station Fire and Emergency Services were on-scene as the first responders to set a perimeter to prevent the contamination from spreading. Also responding were NAS Key West's Port Operations Oil Spill Response Team, the Coast Guard, Florida Department of Environmental

Protection and Key West Pipeline, which owns the pipeline that delivers jet fuel to Boca Chica Field.

The simulation included repairing the pipe and workers involved in the scenario passed through a decontamination station set up by NAS Fire and Emergency Services.


