NAVSTA PEARL INSTRUCTION 5711.1A

Subj: WATERBORNE EMERGENCY FIREFIGHTING CAPABILITY AND
SUPPORT

Ref: (a) Mutual Aid Fire-Fighting Agreement Between Naval
Station Pearl Harbor and the City and County of
Honolulu, HI Fire Department

Encl: (1) Notification and Recall Phone Numbers

1. Purpose. To promulgate the Naval Station, Pearl Harbor (NAVSTA PH) policy for providing tug support/assistance to the City and County of Honolulu Fire Department (HFD) and the United States Coast Guard (USCG). Reference (a) delineates the mutual aid agreement between NAVSTA PH and HFD.

2. Cancellation. NAVSTAPEARLINST 5711.1.

3. Background. NAVSTA PH has the capability to provide firefighting and other waterborne assistance to HFD or the USCG. Such assistance is limited by the equipment installed on its tugboats and smallcraft and operational commitments in effect at the time of any request. The area for which assistance can be provided is defined as the waters from Kewalo Basin to Barbers Point, including Honolulu Harbor. NAVSTA PH tugs and smallcraft may also take a distressed vessel under tow to prevent the loss of life or property, protect the environment or keep the distressed vessel from becoming a hazard to navigation. NAVSTA PH tugs and smallcraft will not be specifically manned or equipped to provide such support, however, every effort will be made to respond when called.

4. Responsibility

a. NAVSTA PH Command Duty Officer (CDO). The CDO will notify the Commanding Officer (CO), Port Operations Officer, Regional Operations Command and Control Center (ROCCC) and Pearl Harbor Control whenever tug or smallcraft assistance is requested by either HFD or USCG. If authorized they will direct

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Pearl Harbor Control to dispatch the identified vessels and notify HFD or USCG as appropriate.

b. Port Operations Officer. The Port Operations Officer, when notified of the request for assistance from HFD or USCG, will determine the availability of support vessels and notify the CO of the request and an assessment of NAVSTA PH's ability to provide such assistance.

c. CO, NAVSTA PH. The CO or designated representative will be the final authority on whether assistance will be provided to HFD or USCG. Assistance will be provided only upon his authorization.

5. Action. When a request for assistance is received from HFD or USCG:

a. The CDO will obtain the exact location of the distressed vessel. This includes the latitude and longitude, harbor name, location within the harbor, and any other information that will aid in quickly locating the vessel.

b. The CDO will notify the Port Operations Officer, ROCCC and Pearl Harbor Control that assistance has been requested. Pearl Harbor Control will in turn notify the contractor duty tug captain that assistance is requested so they may be prepared to respond.

c. The Port Operations Officer will notify the contract tug managers and determine the assistance that can be provided. The number of vessels available, pending harbor movements, and the urgency of the assistance requested will be among the factors evaluated in determining whether support can be provided.

d. The Port Operations Officer will then notify the Executive Officer (XO) and the CO of the request for assistance and an assessment on the level of support that can be provided. The CO, or the XO in his absence, will determine whether assistance can be provided. The Port Operations Officer will inform the CDO of the CO's decision.

e. The CDO will notify Pearl Harbor Control and, as appropriate, the ROCCC, HFD and USCG of the CO's decision. If


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support is authorized they will direct Pearl Harbor Control to dispatch the authorized vessel(s).

f. Pearl Harbor Control will dispatch the authorized vessel(s).

g. The contract tug captain will proceed to the distressed vessel in a safe, expeditious manner. The supporting vessel(s) will return to Pearl Harbor when released by the City and County of HFD or USCG when assistance is no longer required.

h. The City and County of HFD will provide a representative with communication equipment to embark the responding vessel and act as liaison between the vessel Captain and the City and County of HFD. Embarkation at NAVSTA PH will be at pier SIERRA 19. An alternate embarkation site may be coordinated to minimize delay in response time. Alternate sites may include Kewalo Basin, Honolulu Harbor and Barbers Point Harbor.
