Norfolk Car Dealership Removed From Off-Limits List

NORFOLK, Va. – The civilian business establishment Carafello’s Auto Sales, LLC, located at 6328 E. Virginia Beach Blvd. in Norfolk, was removed from the off-limits list by Commander, Navy Region Mid-Atlantic today.

This decision comes as a result of recommendations from the Armed Forces Disciplinary Control Board (AFDCB) for Southeastern Virginia and Northeastern North Carolina, who convened on March 14.

The dealership was placed on the off-limits list on Nov. 12, 2015 after the board determined the dealership was using an illegal business practice known as bird-dogging.

Bird-dogging occurs when someone refers a prospective customer to a particular dealership or salesman for a given fee or compensation. According to Virginia Law, only salespersons licensed to a dealership can assist customers with a purchase of a vehicle.

Carafello’s Auto Sales, LLC provided information to the board on Monday that demonstrated the dealership is now in compliance with Virginia motor vehicle dealer laws and regulations. The removal from the off-limits list is effective immediately.

The establishments will remain on the off-limits list until the next scheduled meeting of the AFDCB, at which time the board will reconsider the status of each business currently on the list.

The AFDCB works closely with businesses that are being considered for the off-limits list to avoid these actions. Mitigation efforts demonstrated by area businesses, and communication to the board by the businesses, often have favorable results.

The safety and security of all service members is a priority for the Department of Defense. The AFDCB is an investigative committee composed of members from each military service in the Hampton Roads area, as well and civilian advisers, who work with local law enforcement agencies and local businesses to identify conditions which may adversely affect the health, safety, welfare, and discipline of the armed forces.
