North American Industry Classification System (NAICS) Code
for your product(s) and/or service(s). Many government product/service listings and future procurements are identified by NAICS Code.

The Size Standards for industries described in **Standard Industrial Classification (SIC) Codes** no longer apply. The new table of small business size standards based on the **NAICS** codes has replaced the table based on SIC Codes.

Data Universal Numbering System (DUNS) Number

Dun and Bradstreet maintain the **DUNS** company identifier system.

Central Contractor Registration (CCR)

You must be registered in the **Central Contractor Registration (CCR)** to be awarded a contract from the Department of Defense (DOD).

Commercial and Government Entity (CAGE) Code

You must register in the Central Contractor Register (CCR) System to obtain a **Commercial and Government Entity (CAGE) Code**. The CAGE Code request process is now incorporated in the CCR registration process

Therefore, upon activation in CCR, your company will be automatically assigned a **CAGE Code**. To view your company **CAGE Code**:

SeaPort-e (Enhanced) Contracting Portal

Services requirements only (as opposed to products requirements) with an estimated value of over \$150,000 are normally posted on ***SeaPort-e***.
